Understanding his language

What's my rabbit trying to say with all his flashing lights?
Your Nabaztag mainly uses light to express things, as he doesn't want to be too intrusive.

Lights will flash on different areas of his body to mean different things.

1. The light under his feet

The light under Nabaztag's feet just shows that your rabbit is alive. When you receive a musical message, it is also used as part of the lightshow.

2. The light on his tummy

Nabaztag mainly uses the luminous areas on his tummy and nose to say things. Different colour animations are used to provide information, as requested in the Services section, or to describe what he is doing.

3. The light on his nose

The nose area is dedicated to telling you that you have received a message.

Activity indicators

1. Connection status

The light under Nabaztag's feet indicates the status of your rabbit's Internet link. The light is purple when he is connected. It is orange when he is not – or no longer - online.

2. Rabbit work in progress

Nabaztag startup

When you plug your Nabaztag into the mains, he automatically starts looking for a Wi-Fi network he can use to connect to the Internet.

The orange lights in his body will gradually turn green as he detects the network, connects to it and logs on to the Nabaztag server. When all lights on his body and nose have turned green, your Nabaztag is up and running.

Downloading...

Whenever you ask Nabaztag to retrieve past messages from the server (see **Receiving Messages** lower), your Rabbit flashes blue lights, from left to right, to signify he is currently downloading them. When he's done, he will automatically play them.

3. Services

Nabaztag's body lights serve to give you the information you requested in the Services section on Nabaztag.com.

Understanding the lingo for services

An example: tomorrow's Weather Forecast for Paris.

Go to the Nabaztag live part of the Services section on Nabaztag.com to visualise the full list of services you have activated.

Click on one of the services, in this case Weather Forecast. In the top right hand corner, you will see an area explaining what your rabbit is currently expressing; in our example, Weather in Paris tomorrow: sunny.

At the same time, the animation at the centre of your screen shows how this information translates into a Nabaztag lightshow: three yellow circles on his tummy.

In the top right hand box, click on Weather language.

Here, you can browse the various types of info that your Rabbit can provide for this particular service: Sun - Rain - Fog - Snow - Storms. Again, the central Nabaztag animation shows how this translates into his luminous language.

Receiving messages

How can I hear my messages? Who's calling? How can I do everything with just one button?

Your friends can send messages on your rabbit. These messages are a combination of animated lights, sound and ear movements.

As soon as he gets a message, your rabbit:

1. Plays the message sender's **Signature**.
2. Plays the incoming message
3. Plays the sender's **Signature** again.

1. Signature

A Signature is a light and/or sound animation that helps to identify a message's sender. Each user can choose a combination of sound and light animation to compose their own Signature.

To find out whom a signature belongs to, go to the [Mailing List](#) page, Messages section, on Nabaztag.com. Click on a sender's name to display their **Card**. You will find their Signature here.

In time, you will learn to recognise each of your correspondents' signatures.

2. The Rabbit Mailing

Once they have been played, incoming messages are stored in the Mailing List.

When there are messages in the Mailing List, Nabaztag's nose flashes a purple light.

3. If I'd rather not be disturbed

Adjust volume / mute

You don't want your rabbit to break out in song all of a sudden? The little button on the bottom rear of Nabaztag has three settings:

- Volume High
- Volume Low
- Mute

When you select mute, don't forget to switch it back on when you're ready to listen to incoming messages.

Putting the rabbit to sleep

You can also go to the "Put my Nabaztag to sleep" tab on the [Personal Info](#) page, My Account, and specify the times during which you want to put your rabbit to sleep, i.e. when you don't want him to play any messages.

When you do this, all incoming messages will be sent to the Rabbit when he wakes up.

How do I switch it off?

Your Nabaztag has no on/off switch: it's designed to stay on 24 hours a day.

Don't worry if Nabaztag starts to feel a little warm, this is quite normal. If you really want to switch him off completely, simply unplug him from the wall socket.

Message management

When a message arrives, and if your Rabbit is not in sleep mode, your Nabaztag plays it instantly.

Once you have heard it, you can:

1. Replay the message

Press once on Nabaztag's head to replay.

If you have received several messages in a row, they are all stored in the rabbit's **Mailing List**.

Press his head to play all messages in the **Mailing List** in the order they arrived. Press his head once during playback to skip to the next message in the **Mailing List**.

2. Archiving messages.

Once you have listened to a message, we recommend you archive it.

When you decide to archive a message, it is deleted from the **Mailing List** and moved to your Archives. Thereafter, when you press his head, your Rabbit will only play new ones.

Nabaztag.com stores archived messages, on the Archived Messages page in the Messages section. You can replay them from here, or even send them back to your Rabbit. They will be added to the **Mailing List**.

Archive a message manually

To **archive one** message from the **Mailing List**, press the Rabbit's head twice during playback. Nabaztag's nose turns orange, and he makes a noise to confirm he has understood; he then plays the next message in the **Mailing List** if any.

Archive all messages

To **archive all** messages from the **Mailing List**, your Rabbit must not be currently playing a message. Press his head twice to **archive all Mailing List** messages. His nose will stop flashing purple to indicate that there are no new messages in the **Mailing List**.

Automatic archive of incoming messages

When you ask your Nabaztag to replay the messages still in his **Mailing List**, they are automatically **archived** once replayed. Your Rabbit considers that, as you have voluntarily asked him to replay these messages, you have now acknowledged them. He therefore decides to remove them from his **Mailing List** and place them in your **Archives**.

You can access a list of archived messages at any time, on the Archived Messages page in the Nabaztag.com Messages section.

Web-based message management

You can also manage your messages directly from the Mailing List or Archived Messages pages in the Nabaztag.com Messages section.

You can consult a full list of both your **Mailing List** messages and **Archived** messages. From there, you can:

- Consult the message sender's Card and view their **Signature**.
- Answer the sender, on his Rabbit if they have one, or via email if they don't.
- Send messages back to your Rabbit for him to replay. If the message was previously archived, it will be moved to the **Mailing List**.
- **Archive** messages from the **Mailing List**.
- Delete messages altogether.

A few real-life Rabbit situations

<p>Case 1: Your Rabbit is always in your presence and within easy reach: on your desk, for instance.</p>	<p>You can actually see your messages arriving. Once you have heard a message, you can</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Press Nabaztag's head twice to archive it.• Press Nabaztag's head once to replay it. Once he has, your Rabbit will automatically archive it.
<p>Case 2: Your Rabbit is always in the same room as you, but out of reach: on your mantelpiece, for instance.</p>	<p>You can actually see and hear your messages as they arrive on the Rabbit. But he is too far away for you to be able to archive them.</p> <p>When your Rabbit is within reach, you can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Press Nabaztag's head twice, when he is not playing a message, to archive all incoming messages without needing to replay them.• Press Nabaztag's head once to replay all the messages he has received, in chronological order. During message playback, you can press once to skip to the next message. Once they have all been played, these messages are removed from the Mailing List and automatically archived. <p>We recommend you archive all messages before you leave the room, so that you can listen to new incoming messages only when you return.</p>
<p>Case 3: Your Rabbit is not in the location you spend most of your time in: at home while you're away at work, for instance.</p>	<p>In your absence, incoming messages are played automatically on your Rabbit.</p> <p>When you return, if your Nabaztag's nose is purple, this means you have new messages. Press your Rabbit's head to play them all in chronological order of arrival. During message playback, you can press his head once to skip to the next message.</p> <p>Once they have all been played, your messages are removed from the Mailing List and automatically archived.</p> <p>We recommend you archive all messages before you leave your Rabbit unattended, so that you can listen to new incoming messages only when you return.</p>
